Our Ranch Hope leadership has been doing just that and are excited to announce our latest project: a new state-of-the-art cafetorium (a dining and auditorium facility) for our youth and staff. The plan to create this facility is in two parts; the first is a fundraising gala on October 21<sup>st</sup> which also honors our founders, Rev. The second way to help is through donations, making this modern facility a reality for our youth. The hope is to renovate our current facility that is presently used for serving over 60,000 meals a year and providing a place for our youth and community to hold special events, plays and training.

Our cafetorium was originally built in 1986 and it has served us faithfully, but is in need of a reviving. The walk-in refrigerator and freezer are barely operating and many of the appliances are in desperate need of replacement. Our goal is to create a life skills training center where our youth can further their education and culinary skills while enjoying farm-to-table meals with the emphasis on nutrition, as well as an area of fellowship and respite for all.

The focal point is a huge farm table that stretches from one side of the room to the other so that everyone can eat together, as a family. This cutting-edge description is one of our youth’s dream dining hall.

Jay’s full vision for a state-of-the-art cafeteria may seem like a fantasy but he does have the right idea in mind. If you only think of a dining hall as a building that provides nutritious meals a few times a day you’re missing the bigger picture—community is an essential

part of any dining facility. We fully believe that God uses this open space to reach all of our youth in different ways. To Jay, our cafeteria was where he starred as Romeo in the school play, a work study opportunity where he learned skills that will take him beyond his time at the ranch, an environment to explore musical aspirations, an open area to seek God’s provision through Bible studies, and a space where friends became family.

One of the most influential experiences Jay had at the Ranch was his work study program. On the surface washing dishes, taking out trash and cleaning floors might seem like tedious work but these simple tasks are invaluable. They teach lessons on time management, self-discipline, teamwork, communication, flexibility, and problem-solving abilities. Jay (and many other youth) will be able to take all of these skills and more to future schooling and career opportunities. When asked “if you could tell RH supporters one thing what would it be?” Jay responded,

***“Thank you! Thank you for giving me a second chance.”***

Thanks to you, for over 57 years Ranch Hope’s dining hall has been an opportunity for second chances. Similar to most teens, our youth are unique, creative, adventurous, resilient, and intelligent. Just like all of us, our youth need grace and a community who supports them. Our dining hall meets all of our youth where they are and gives them space to grow. Please join us on this journey as we revive our cafeteria so it can continue to be a multipurpose space that gives second changes and change lives.
