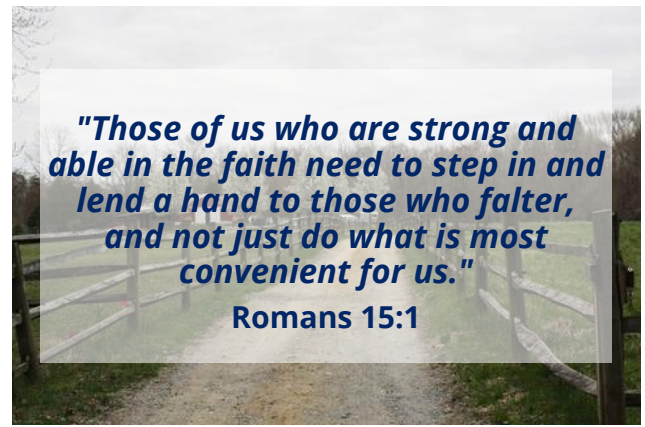

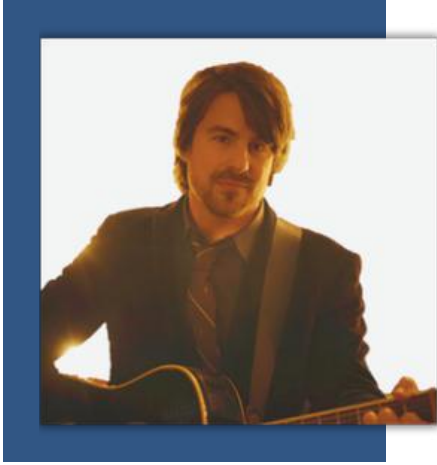

Youth are admitted to Shelter of HOPE through referrals from the Division of Child Protection and Permanency, Care Management Organizations, or Detention Diversion.

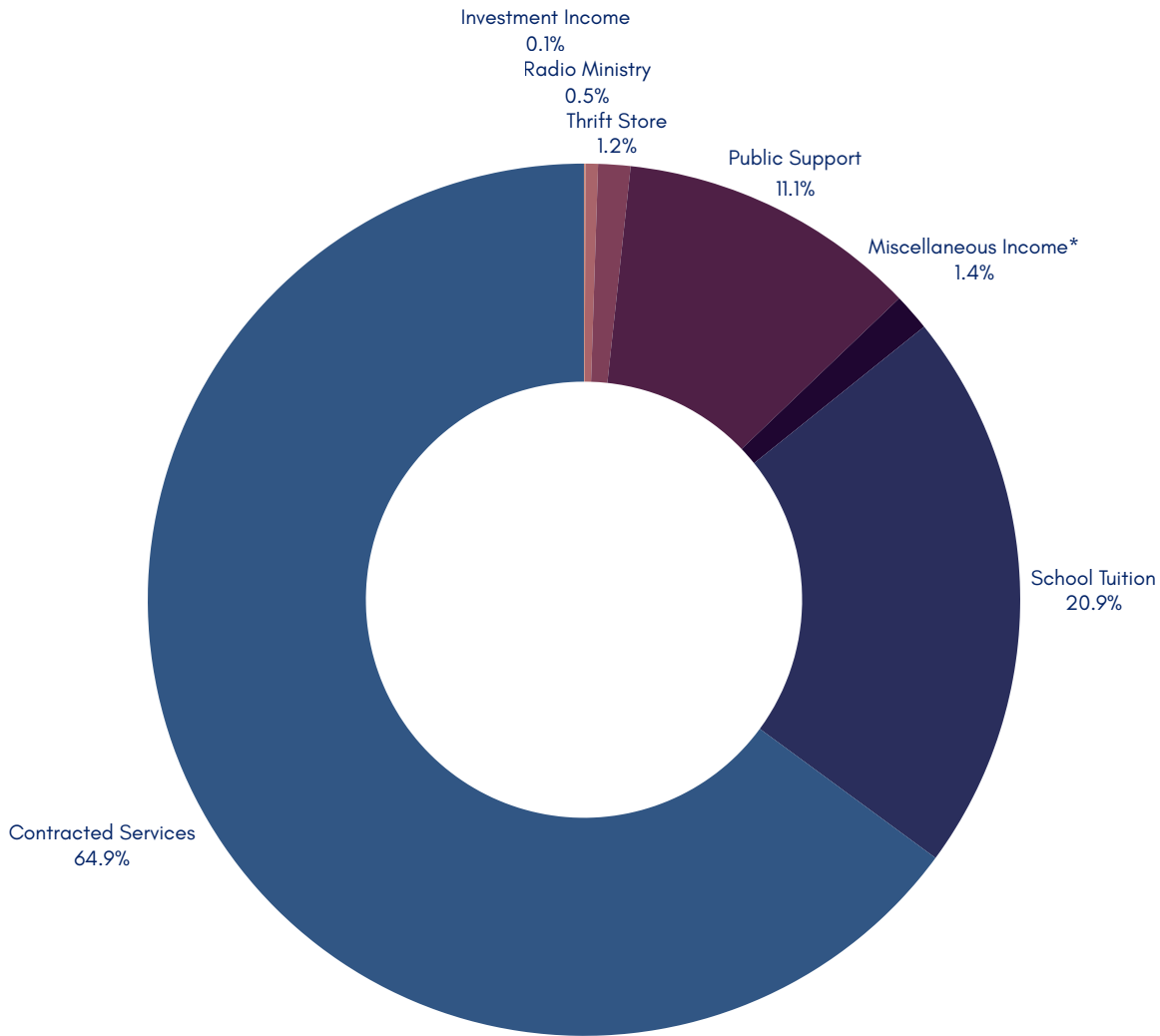

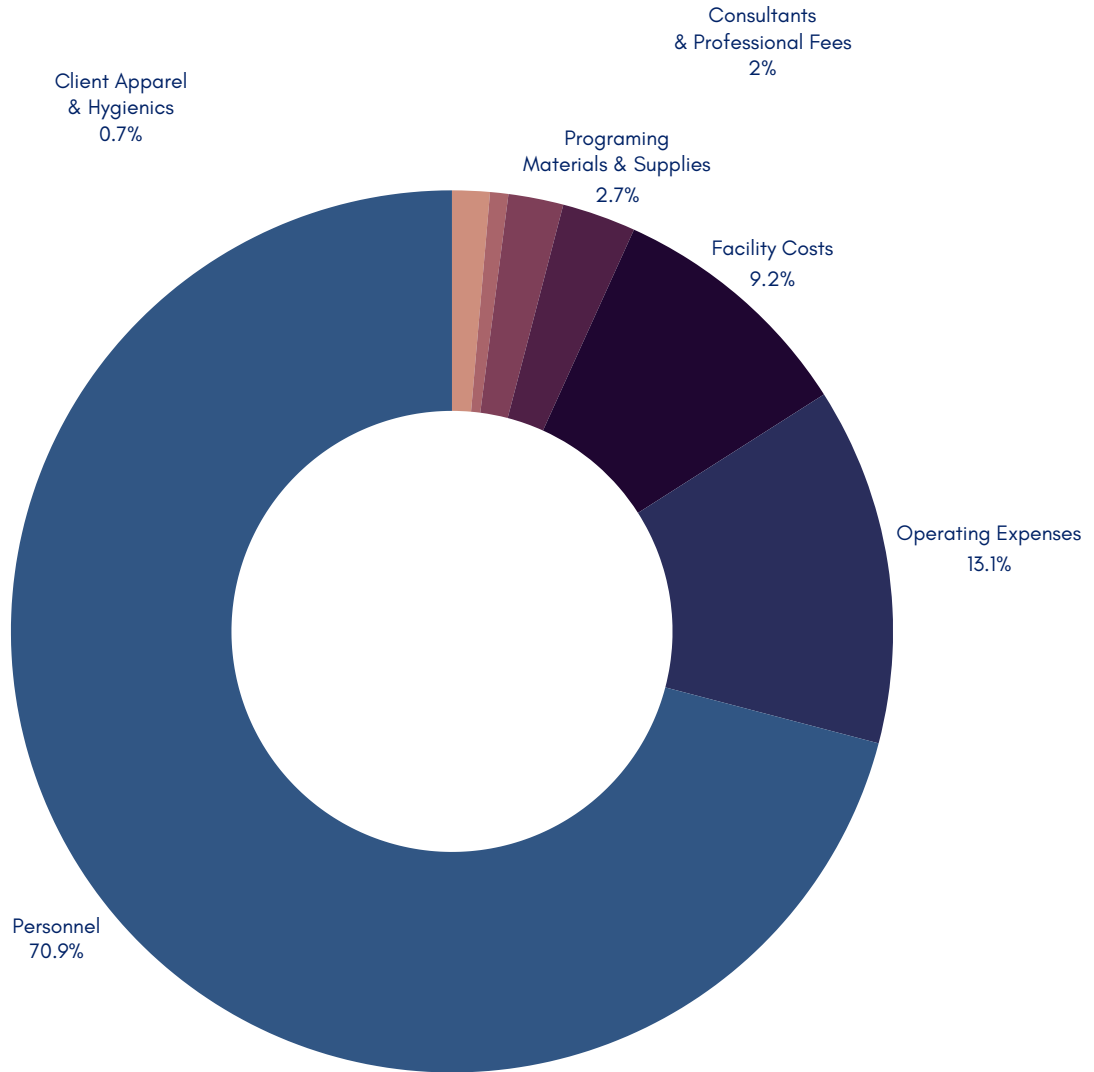
